



## Regulations

### Scratching

This was invented by DJ Grand Wizzard Theodore in the 1970's. Through unique manipulations of the record (moving it back and forth), the turntablist creates new sounds by turning the mixer on and off with the option and/or aid of any other devices on a mixer. These original sounds, which vary in unlimited tones, are created entirely by the musician and truly sound like "scratching" - hence, the name. (Scratching Category) There will be two World Category Elimination heats before the World Category Finals. 1st half will be the Western Hemisphere (USA) and the 2nd half, the Eastern Hemisphere (Europe). Each heat will produce One Champion that will advance to the World Finals to face the Defending "Scratching" Champion from the previous year. At the world finals each will get 3mins each 2 rounds each.

### Beat juggling

This category was brought to new levels by DJ Aladdin and Steve Dee. in the mid 1980's. This is the action of creating a combination of continuous rhythmical tempo with one or two records. The turntablist uses any given drum pattern and manually changes the sequence of beats, creating an entirely new drum pattern(s). This process usually requires the use of two turntables being used back and forth. "Beat Juggling Category" There will be two World Category Elimination heats before the World Category Finals. 1st half will be the Western Hemisphere (USA) and the 2nd half, the Eastern Hemisphere (Europe). Each heat will produce One Champion that will advance to the World Finals to face the Defending Beat Juggling Champion from the previous year. At the world finals each will get 3mins each 2 rounds each.

### Teams / DJ Bands

This category was made popular by the X-Men, The Beat Junkies, and the Invizibl Skratch Piklz in the late 1980's to the 1990's. A combination of two or more individuals in which together they make a musical composition by using a mixture of beat juggling, scratching, or any other form of noise manipulation. "Team Category" There will be two World Category Elimination heats before the World Category Finals. 1st half will be the Western Hemisphere (USA) and the 2nd half, the Eastern Hemisphere (Europe). Each heat will produce One "Team" Champion that will advance to the World Finals to face the Defending "Team" Champions from the previous year. At the world finals each will get 6mins to showcase their "Team" skills.
